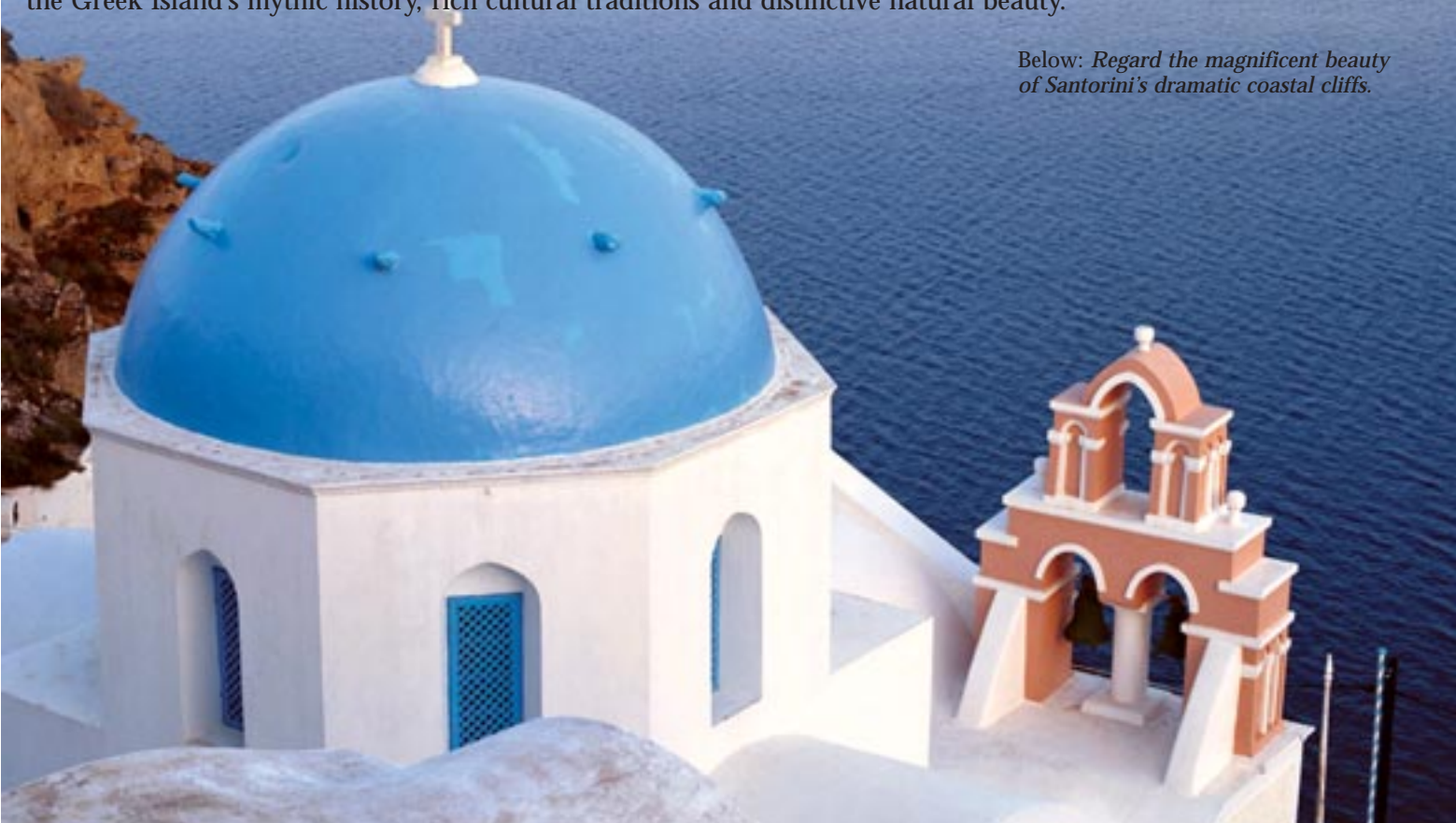

**UNITED STATES, Friday, October 7**

Depart the United States en route to Athens, Greece.

**ATHENS, GREECE, Saturday, October 8**

Birthplace of democracy and home to some of history's greatest philosophers and poets from Socrates to Herodotus. Athens is unmatched in its contributions to early Western civilization. Today, the spectacular Acropolis still commands the city's skyline, and is crowned with the Parthenon, a perfectly executed work of Doric architecture created to honor Athena, the city's patron deity.

**DELOS, GREECE, Sunday, October 9**

From the dawn of Greek civilization, Delos held an esteemed position as one of the most sacred islands in the Greek world. As the mythical birthplace of Apollo and Artemis, it was as central to Greek spiritual life as Olympia or Delphi. Drawing close to the shore, gaze upon the magnificent Lion Terrace—sleek marble lions carved from Naxian marble in the seventh century B.C. The Sanctuary of Apollo is a spectacularly rich archaeological site with remains of three separate temples from the fifth and sixth centuries B.C. Delos' awe-inspiring ruins include an entire district of ancient homes dating from 700 B.C. and the ancient Theater built in 300 B.C. Especially fascinating is the House of the Dolphins with its intricate mosaic of two dolphins crafted in the second century B.C.

**MYKONOS, GREECE, Sunday, October 9**

According to ancient legend, this island's craggy hills and clefts were formed from the petrified bodies of giants killed by Hercules. With charming windmills, bright whitewashed homes and golden sandy beaches, it epitomizes life in the Greek Isles. The labyrinth of dazzling white alleys and cube-shaped homes of Mykonos Town was deliberately designed to confound both winds and pirate raids.

**KUŞADASI, TURKEY (EPHESUS), Monday, October 10**

A lively Aegean resort known for its beaches, bazaars and seaside restaurants, Kuşadası—whose name means “bird island”—was a minor Genoese naval outpost settled in the 14th century. Today, the original fort (though restored) still stands atop a small island linked to the shore by a narrow causeway, while the town itself offers a unique opportunity to bargain for Turkish carpets in its bustling market or sample a taste of Turkey's legendary cuisine while overlooking the blue waters of the Aegean.

Accessible from Kuşadası through the sunflower-brightened countryside, the extensive ruins of the ancient city of Ephesus are

among the world's greatest relics of antiquity. Home of the Library of Celsus, one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World, and later one of the Roman Empire's regional capitals, Ephesus retains astonishing memorials to its importance in ancient times. Harbor Street, or Arcadiana, was one of the few illuminated roads during the classical period, and the Marble Way leads to the astonishing 24,000-seat amphitheater, where St. Paul preached. The wealthiest families of first-century Ephesus once lived in the Terrace Houses, and the six-domed Basilica of St. John was constructed in the fifth century as a monument over the tomb of St. John.

**PÁTAMOS, GREECE, Tuesday, October 11**

Known as the “Jerusalem of the Aegean,” Pátmos is the island where, around A.D. 95, St. John the Divine received the vision of fire and brimstone he dictated as the Book of Revelation. Explore the massive, fortress-like Monastery of St. John. Founded in 1088, the monastery was built to protect religious treasures such as the sixth-century Codex Porphyries, which contain many of the Gospels of St. Mary, and the Cave where St. John is said to have received his vision.

**RHODES (LINDOS), GREECE, Wednesday, October 12**

With a magnificent array of eleven arched gates, carefully restored Ottoman buildings and the immaculately restored Palace of the Grand Masters built by the Knights of St. John, Rhodes Town offers one of the most impressive walled medieval cities in all of Europe.

Located on a high bluff overlooking the east coast of the historically strategic island of Rhodes is the soaring Acropolis of Lindos. Its most famous landmark, the Temple of Athena, was built in the sixth-century B.C. Lindos' whitewashed houses, stunning location and impressive 14th-century fortress built by the Knight of John make Lindos one of the most appealing towns in the Greek Isles.

**SANTORINI (OIA), GREECE,**

*Thursday, October 13*

Wake to awe-inspiring black cliffs soaring above the ship in Santorini, the “black pearl of the Aegean.” A cable car rises above Santorini to the town of Thira, whose stunning white walls stand in stark contrast against the dark volcanic cliffs. Perched on the northern tip of the island, the delightful hamlet of Oia is Santorini's most picturesque village. Far below, in what remains of an extinct volcano's caldera, may be the legendary remains of Atlantis—possibly lost during a cataclysmic volcanic eruption in the 16th century B.C.

**NÁXOS, GREECE, Friday, October 14**

Largest and most fertile of the islands of the Cyclades Archipelago, Naxos was a major center of the Cycladic civilization and claims a heritage dating back to Minoan and Mycenaean times. During the Byzantine and Venetian eras, it flourished as a center of commerce and culture, and today visitors come from afar to admire its Temple of Apollo. Its most famous landmark is the impressive Portára Gateway, built in 522 B.C. as a gateway to an unfinished Temple of Apollo. With its twisting alleys, fascinating Byzantine churches, Venetian castle and Greek Orthodox cathedral, Naxos Town offers visitors an opportunity to sample the authentic culture and rich history of the island and its inhabitants.

**ATHENS, GREECE/UNITED STATES, Saturday, October 15**

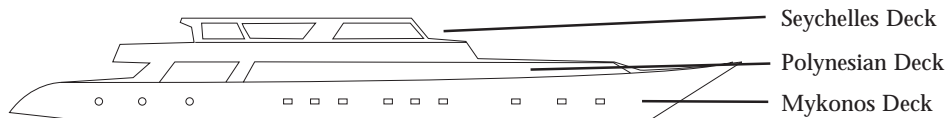
