

## **SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED INFECTIONS**

Confidential testing for HIV and other sexually transmitted infections is available by appointment. The most commonly ordered tests include:

- › HIV antibody test - \$27-\$45 (\$30 for rapid testing)-*(best done 3-6 months after most recent potential risk)*
- › Herpes - \$20
- › Chlamydia and Gonorrhea – (\$25.50 per test)
- › Syphilis - \$13
- › Trichomonas and other vaginal or cervical infections - \$5

Evaluation and counseling is also available for:

- › HPV (genital warts)
- › Pubic lice (crabs)
- › Scabies

Time varies from exposure to detectable symptoms. It is important to speak with your provider about your risk factors.

### **Please note:**

A \$5 specimen/lab collection processing fee is charged directly to student account for any tests sent to our reference lab and is not billed to insurance.

## **WOMEN'S HEALTH SERVICES**

The Davison Health Center offers a wide range of women's health services including:

- › Ortho brand and Solia birth control pills - \$20.00 per cycle
- › Nuva Ring - \$50.00 (4 week cycle)
- › Diaphragm - \$50.00
- › Pap Smear - \$35.00
- › Gardasil (HPV vaccine) \$155 per shot of 3-part series (Merck offers rebate program – ask for more details)

Students interested in starting on birth control should contact the DHC for an appointment for consultation and gynecological exam.

Students interested in purchasing birth control through DHC and currently receiving gynecological care elsewhere will need to comply with the following (Appointment required):

1. Complete a DHC gynecological form which will be reviewed by provider.
2. Sign DHC informed consent form which will be reviewed by provider.
3. Provide DHC with a copy of current Pap smear, accompanying pelvic exam, breast exam, blood pressure and urinalysis.

## **EMERGENCY CONTRACEPTION**

DHC encourages patients to use the contraceptive of their choice before or during intercourse. For women who do not wish to become pregnant and who have had unprotected intercourse, failed contraception, or been sexual assaulted, there may be an option for a “second chance” to prevent pregnancy if taken within 72 hours. The “morning after pill” is available at DHC for \$22. ## **PREGNANCY OPTIONS**

Pregnancy testing is offered at DHC for \$10.00. Counseling is available to discuss prenatal care, abortion options and adoption. Referrals are made to local providers for these services.

Information on abortion procedures, local abortion sites and costs for services is available at DHC.

Please note that Connecticut has no required waiting period for obtaining an abortion and no parental consent laws.

Students enrolled in the University Insurance Program are eligible for pregnancy coverage and up to \$180 for abortion services. Private insurance plans vary on abortion coverage. Please check your individual plan for specific details.

## **WELLNESS AND SEXUAL HEALTH**

DHC is committed to meeting the primary care and referral needs of all our students. A wellness and sexual health service is available for all students regardless of gender by appointment with a provider of your choice. The bulk of all sexual health visits consist of providing information, answering questions and assessing the patient's risk for STI's. All visits are conducted in the strictest confidence. All testing is confidential. Students are asked to complete a pre-visit survey to assist the provider in meeting your specific needs.

## **INSURANCE INFORMATION**

All visits to the Health Center are free. There is a cost for laboratory tests including Pap smear, STI tests and prescription medications. Student accounts can be billed for services; the charge will appear on the bill as “miscellaneous health fee”.

Students wishing to file a claim to their insurance company may request a “superbill” statement to submit for reimbursement. DHC is not able to directly bill students' private insurance, although Quest will bill to insurance for any outside lab testing.
