This talk by architect **Arkadiusz Piegdon '08** will explore the joys and challenges of small-scale architectural practice. Piegdon will present progress shots, construction drawings, models, and renderings to illustrate the reality of the building process.

Piegdon is a licensed New York State architect with Lynne Breslin Architects, and has over 15 years of experience in residential projects from concept through construction administration. Featured projects include Lescaze Restoration, an ongoing restoration of a William Lescaze home in Tuxedo Park; Lumber Lane Barns, a complex reconstruction and reconfiguration of three historic barns into a single-family residence; and Tumbling Walls, a new residential construction utilizing a structural steel frame.
