


The **CRRA Trash Museum** offers 6,500 square feet of exciting and educational exhibits for adults and kids of all ages. Your tour begins at the Temple of Trash, decorated with colorful and sometimes surprising items (dolls, record players, bicycles) pulled from Connecticut garbage bins. Discover why the old-fashioned "town dump" wasn't such a great idea — and learn about modern solutions to waste management, such as source reduction, recycling, landfills, and trash-to-energy plants. Check out a colorful mural that tells the tale of trash from pre-historic times to today, and find out just how little garbage "Sustainable Dave" generated in one year.

The biggest thrill of a Trash Museum visit is watching CRRA's single-stream recycling facility in full swing. From the mezzanine viewing area — and also via a closed-circuit television system — follow newspapers, cardboard, junk mail, bottles, cans and plastic containers from the tipping floor through the sorting process, and watch them get crushed and baled before being shipped to markets and made into new products.
