TRANSFER CREDIT POLICY - Department of Economics

Weselyan regulations about the transfer of credits are designed to protect students from the misunderstanding that can arise when students take a course at another institution and discover upon returning to Wesleyan that it cannot be counted towards their degree. Hence, Faculty Regulations specify that credit will be awarded for courses taken at another institution only if approval is obtained *in advance*.

To receive credit for an economics course that you are planning to take at another institution, you must submit either: "Permission to Transfer Credit from Another College or University" (summer study or academic leave) or the relevant section of "Application for Study Abroad" (study abroad or domestic-approved program). In addition, you must complete this form, and attach a copy of a course description from the school catalog or equivalent document along with the cover sheet of the document. Submit both forms and attachments to the Administrative Assistant for the Economics Department. She will review your application and obtain the signature of the department chair.
