The International Student Financial Aid Application is designed to gather information from international students who are applying for financial aid at Wesleyan University. When completing the application, it is important to:

Answer all questions that apply to you and your family.

Convert all currency figures to U.S. dollars (\$) before entering them on the form.

Return the form directly to Wesleyan University Financial Aid Office.

Some of the questions on the International Student Financial Aid Application are selfexplanatory; the instructions that follow are only provided for questions that may need further explanation.

Section A-Student's Information

This section pertains to the student who is applying for aid.

Section B-Parents' Information

On this application, "parents" may mean either the custodial or noncustodial parent(s). The custodial parent or parents (or legal guardian) are the parent/parents with whom the student lives. If the student's biological or adoptive parents are divorced or separated, the custodial parent/parents are the parent/parents with whom the student has lived the most during the 12 months prior to filling out the application. Both the custodial and noncustodial parents should fill out separate copies of this application. If the custodial or noncustodial parent has remarried, please include the biological/adoptive parent and stepparent information in the "parents" section.


