GARRY GOLDEN is an academically trained Futurist who speaks and consults on issues shaping business and society in the 21st century. Garry is Co-author of *Designing Your Future*. He has led workshops and delivered keynote addresses across a wide range of civic and cultural institutions including: The Art Institutes (EDMC), BRIC Arts/Media, New York Library Association, McGraw-Hill Companies, California Association of Museums, Philadelphia Museum of Art, Right Brain Initiative, and Woodruff Center for the Arts.



ERIC BOOTH has served on the faculty of Juilliard for the past 13 years, where he cofounded the Arts and Education Program and Mentoring Programs. He has also taught at Stanford University, NYU and Lincoln Center Institute. He recently completed Arts Survive, a study of sustainability of arts education partnerships. His teaching and writing for the past decade have largely focused on arts education and the improvement of teaching and assessment across elementary and secondary settings.
