

If you recently tested + on a Rapid Antigen test, please review the following details and complete the form below:

Please fill out [this form](#) to report your symptoms and needed information for isolation.

In addition, please abide by the following protocols:

- In order to reduce transmission of the COVID-19 virus throughout the community, you should begin isolation immediately. Do not attend class, eat in the dining hall or be near others until you receive a negative rapid test.
- You should take a rapid test five days from your positive test result or from the onset of symptoms. You may pick up a test kit from the Health Center weekdays between 9:00-5:00, and from Public Safety at all other times. If your results are negative, you can cautiously return to regular activities with the caveat that you **MUST** wear a mask when interacting with other people, inside or outside, for the following 5 days. If your results are positive, you should test again two days later. If still positive, your isolation period will end on day ten after the onset of symptoms or your first positive test result.
- The Health Center will send you and your class dean an absence note that can be shared with your professors.
- You will isolate in your assigned residence. If an immunocompromised student would like to be relocated during their roommate's isolation, that student should submit this [form](#). A limited number of rooms are available for this purpose.
- Be sure to wear a KN95 mask whenever you are not alone in your bedroom. Masks can be obtained at the Health Center and at Public Safety.
- During isolation, you may leave your room to go to the bathroom, to go outside your building by yourself (masked and 12' of distance from others), and to pick-up a "to-go" meal from Usdan Marketplace.
- Use disinfectant wipes before and after touching surfaces in shared kitchens and bathrooms. Wipes are available for free from the Health Center and from Public Safety.
- Should you have an urgent maintenance need, please call 860-685-3400 and let them know you are currently isolating in that campus locations so that they may take the necessary precautions.

If you have a fever higher than 102, difficulty breathing, severe cough, or anything you feel is out of the ordinary, please call the Davison Health Center at 860-685-2470, we are available around the clock. Please do not call the Health Center to report your positive result unless you have the above concerns (use the online form for reporting).
