RE: Student Conduct Statistical Analysis Academic Years—2014-2015 through 2016-2017

The information below provides a comprehensive statistical analysis of the most common violation data for the 2014 through 2017 academic years.

During the 2014-2015 academic year, 1,115 students were charged with allegedly violating 1,588 regulations of the CNAC. Throughout the 2015-2016 Academic Year 830 were charged with allegedly violating 1,218 regulations of the CNAC. These data represent a 26% decrease in the number of students charged with an alleged violation and a 23% decrease in the number of alleged violations of the CNAC between the 2014-2015 and 2015-2016 academic years.

During the current reporting period, 738 students2were charged with allegedly violating 1,038 regulations of the Code of Non Academic Conduct (CNAC). These data represents an 11% decrease in the number of students charged and a 15% decrease in the number of alleged violations between the 2015-2016 and 2016-2017 academic years.

Of the 1,115 students charged with alleged violations of the CNAC during the 2014-2015 academic year 690 (62%) were male and 425 (38%) were female. By comparison, during the 2015-2016 academic year, out of the 830 students charged with a violation, 509 (61%) were male and 325 (38%) were female students. During the current reporting period, there were 738 students charged with a violation, this includes 308 (42%) were male and 409 (55%) were female students. Twenty-One (21, 3%) of the students charged during the current reporting period were not identified by gender.

During the 2014-2015 reporting period, 1,536 charges were issued of the most common violations. One Thousand and Fourteen (1,014, 66%) violations were confirmed and 522 (34%) were found not responsible. During the 2015-2016 reporting period, 1,167 charges were issued of the most common violations. Fifty-Nine percent (59%) were confirmed and 475 (41%) were found not responsible. During the current reporting period (2016-2017), 959 charges were issued of the most common violations. These data suggest 61% were found responsible and 539 (39%) were found not responsible.
