

Hello First Year Students & Graduate Students!

Back in August/September, you may remember completing Part 1 of the training courses: **AlcoholEdu & Sexual Assault Prevention for Undergraduates/Graduates**. Now that you have started your journey at Wes, you are required to complete Part 2 of both courses to continue to support your education. These courses are essential part of creating a safe and healthy environment for all of our community members. **Note: Part 2 of these courses is much shorter in length than Part 1.**

Completion of your EVERFI courses is required for all students @ Wes. If you have difficulty logging in, check out the technical info at the bottom of this page.

Please ensure that you have completed the course by Friday, November 12th.

To Complete Part 2:

1. Sign in to your Wesleyan Portal (WesPortal), click on the Student Information drop-down, and click on the AlcoholEdu & Sexual Assault Prevention link.
2. Click on either/both AlcoholEdu or Sexual Assault Prevention for Undergrads/Grads to begin taking part 2 of the course.
3. You may log in and out of the course at the end of each section. Section ends are marked with a “Next” button. **DO NOT log out until you click the “Next” button or you will have to repeat the section you have just gone through.**
4. To log back into your account, you can access AlcoholEdu and Sexual Assault Prevention from your Wesleyan Portal or at https://admin.fifoundry.net/wesleyan-univeristy/sign_in
